### Booking your flight to Cape Town

There are many international airlines travelling to South Africa with Johannesburg's **OR Tambo International Airport** and **Cape Town International Airport** being the primary destinations. Cape Town International Airport is located 22km east of Cape Town. Car hire is available at the airport outside the international and domestic terminals. Metered taxis and shuttle services are also available for transport from the airport.
